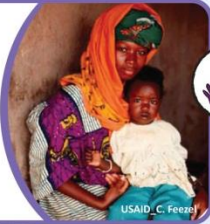

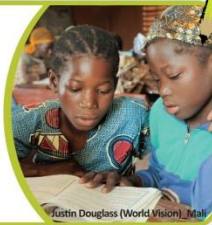

Specific Objectives

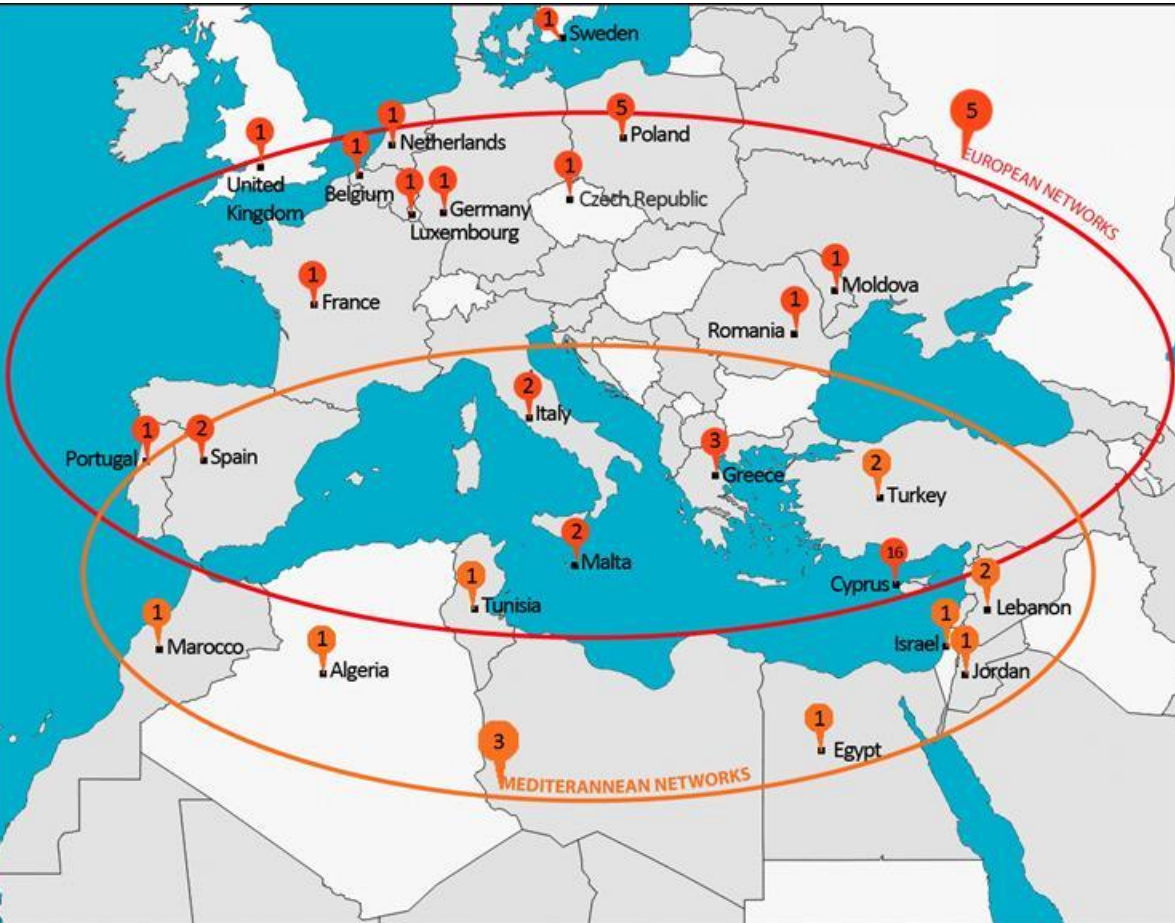
- Promote inclusive decision making

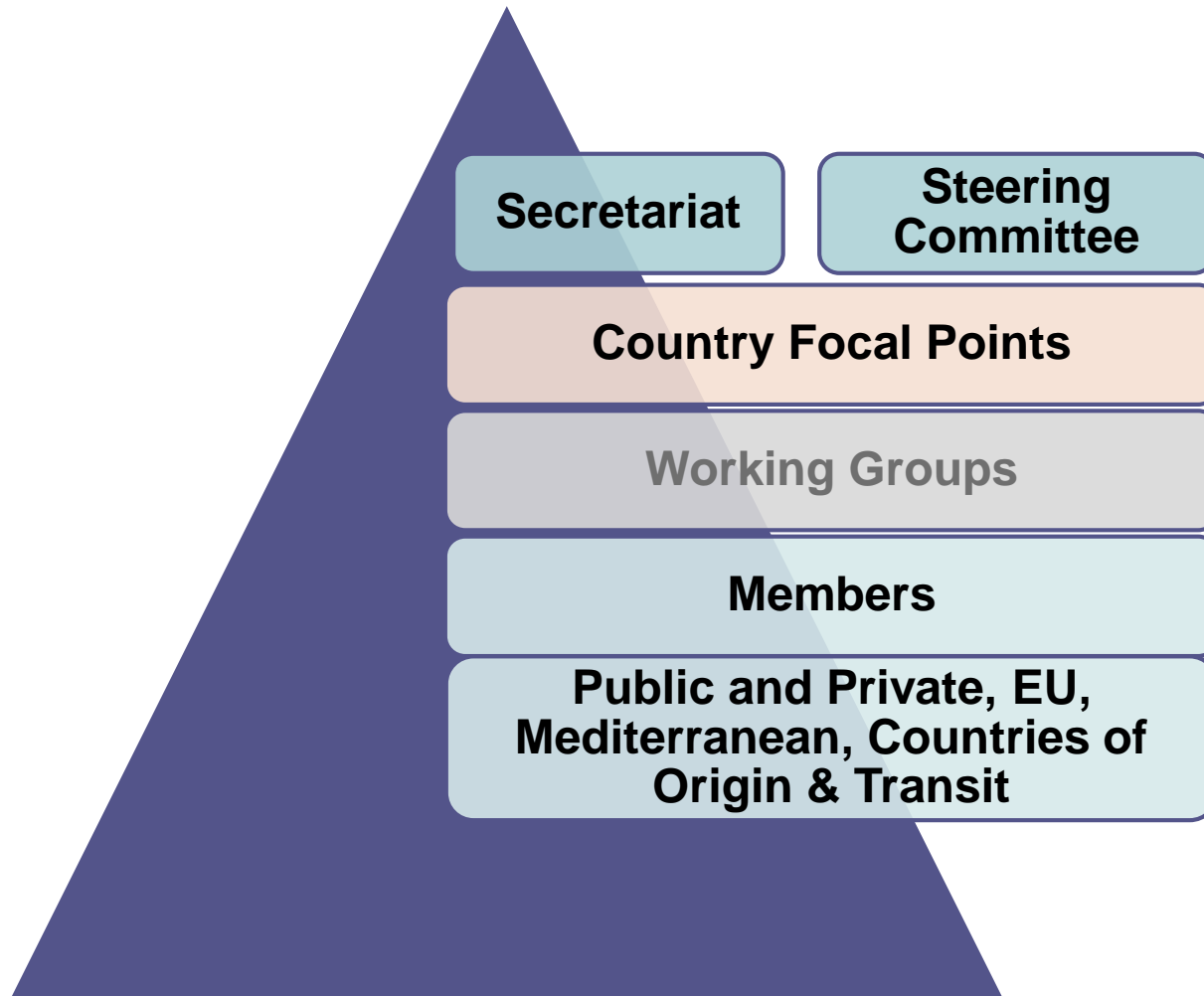

- Ineffective cooperation between public and private organizations
- Competition instead of collaboration among NGOs
- Lack of transparency
- Multiple definitions and approaches towards integration
- Imbalanced responsibility between North and South
- Lack of participation of countries of origin and transit in decision making
- A common migration policy framework
- Practical support and training to fieldworkers

Needs and Challenges

- Negative stereotypes – Campaigns
- Gap between Policy and practice
- No holistic and coordinated support
- Lobbying and advocacy
- Definitions and interpretations of integration and Human Rights
- Participation of migrants' associations and CSOs from decision making
